2. What does Romans 1:18-23 reveal about the nature of humanity's response to God?

3. How does the passage connect the idea of thankfulness to our understanding of God?

4. In what ways can idolatry affect our ability to be thankful?

5. How can we cultivate a heart of thankfulness in light of this passage?

6. What role does acknowledgment of God's sovereignty play in fostering thankfulness?

7. How can we help others understand the importance of thankfulness as depicted in Romans 1?

6. In what ways can we encourage a culture of thankfulness during communion, as mentioned in verse 17?

7. What role does community play in the practice of communion, based on these verses?
